## PRESCRIBED BURN PERMITTING INFORMATION

- Prescribed Burn Permits are required only when a Burn Ban is in effect. Burn Ban status may be checked online at www.co.washington.tx.us or by calling (979) 277-6200 ext. 120.
  The landowner should contact the Washington County Environmental Department to receive information on prescribed burn permitting procedures, and to obtain a permit application.
  Permit applications are not available online or from any other source. This is intended to inform the landowner of their responsibilities. The permit application fee is \$25, and is non-refundable.
  Permit applications expire one year from the date of application if authorization has not been issued during that time.
- The proposed prescribed burn may not be conducted until after written authorization has been issued from this office.
- Contact information for all persons that is required on the application must be provided, including phone numbers.
- A map and written directions identifying the subject property (burn location) must be provided.
- **GPS Coordinates** for the subject property (burn location) must be provided.
- **Gate Code(s)** for the subject property (burn location) must be provided or <u>If there is no gate</u> and/or lock it must be so indicated.
- The landowner or lessee of the prescribed burn property must demonstrate financial responsibility by submitting proof of liability insurance covering prescribed burning in an amount of not less than \$500,000.
- Prescribed Burn Plans <u>must</u> be in writing and prepared and reviewed by an appropriately trained and experienced person associated with the Natural Resources Conservation Service, South Central Texas Prescribed Burn Association, Texas Agri-Life Extension Service, Texas Forest Service, or Texas Parks and Wildlife Department; and the reviewer must certify that to the best of their knowledge it meets the criteria necessary to safely conduct a prescribed burn if followed correctly by signing the permit application.
- The prescribed burn **must be conducted under the supervision of a burn boss/manager**, who is <u>qualified to act as such</u> by the organization that prepared and/or reviewed the burn plan.
