
Median household income is \$5.1K below the national median household income of \$75.1K.

## Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population increased by 4.3% since 2018, growing by 1,522. Population is expected to increase by 5.0% between 2023 and 2028, adding 1,832.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs increased by 6.4% in Washington County, TX from 17,565 to 18,686. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 4.5% by 1.9%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 51.7% to 54.5% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, 19.8% of Washington County, TX residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (1.4% below the national average), and 7.6% hold an Associate's Degree (1.2% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and State Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.



## Educational Attainment







## Unemployment by Gender







## Population Trends




## Job Trends




## Unemployment Rate Trends

Washington County, TX had an October 2024 unemployment rate of 3.92%, increasing from 3.41% 5 years before.






**Millennials**

Washington County, TX has 5,600 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 7,519.




**Retiring Soon**

Retirement risk is high in Washington County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 11,172 people 55 or older, while there are 13,377 here.




**Racial Diversity**

Racial diversity is low in Washington County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 15,412 racially diverse people, while there are 13,855 here.




**Veterans**

Washington County, TX has 2.72 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.6 per 1,000 people.




**Property Crime**








## Top Industry Employment Concentration





## Top Occupation Employment Concentration






